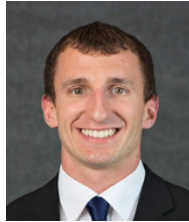

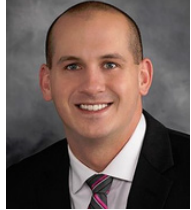

# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Happy Anniversary! At the time of this writing in 2024, the Foundation is celebrating our 40th anniversary. The red ruby, which is the traditional symbol of the marital 40th anniversary, represents an inner flame symbolizing that things are alive, strong and thriving, even after 40 years. This description could not be more accurate for the Foundation; from 1984 to 2024, we have grown from \$400,000 to \$27,231,900 in total assets. More importantly, the Foundation gave over \$900,000 to charitable causes in 2023. It makes this anniversary even more meaningful to know we are sharing it; it's also the 50th anniversary of the Crestline Harvest Festival, the 40th anniversary of the Galion Community Theatre, and the 10th anniversary of yours truly as the President of the Foundation!

Anniversaries call on us to reflect on our journey to the present, and it's important we also take time to plan ahead for our future. In her book, *Future Good* by Trista Harris, the author makes her case that the future is not out of our control. It is instead determined by the choices we make today, and she suggests using the past to create possible scenarios of the future. While we can't possibly know exactly what is going to happen and when, we can use futurism as a tool to change what we do today to make tomorrow better. Since humans naturally resist change and yet want stability, she insists that what we need is "persistent adaptability." This involves consistently using change as an opportunity for growth. Through scenario planning, it is possible to have many viable ways to think about the future as new opportunities arise, and she suggests that this is better than only having a strategic plan, especially during times of significant change like we are seeing now. To know you have a plan of possible action scenarios can also be a soothing antidote for these rapidly changing, stressful times.

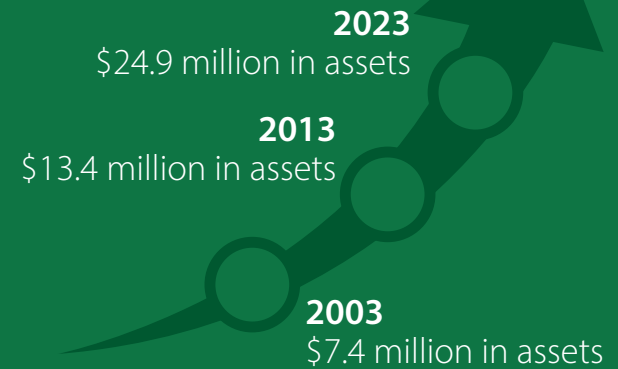
Soon it will be time for the Foundation's Board to conduct our next strategic planning. Should we add scenario planning to our discussions, there are some future topics I can see us addressing. ONE: As Congress continues to debate the status of endowed and donor advised funds, their decisions could directly affect how we do business in the future. TWO: The Foundation is aware of more than one large contribution coming in the form of planned (estate) gifts. The resulting exponential growth could mean big changes in the amounts of money we are able to return to the community yearly. THREE: If one day financial limits would have a lesser effect on our grantmaking, might we be able to engage in proactive granting? Imagine asking yourself the question, "What would we like to see in our community if money was not as limited? FOUR: As weather disasters and mass shootings continue to be a common part of the human existence, what can we take from other communities who have persevered through such occurrences and apply to our own recovery?

*The Complete Book of Zingers* by Croft M. Pentz provides witty one liners about several different topics, including the future. "The future: that time when you'll wish that you would have done all the things that you aren't doing now." "You can't plan for the future in the future – you have to start now!" "Take interest in the future – that is where you will spend the rest of your life." Locally, we can't talk about our future without giving a shout out to the Galion-Crestline and Bucyrus Area Chambers of Commerce, who announced earlier this year that they will be joining forces as one united Crawford County Chamber of Commerce in 2025! Kudos to the decision makers from both entities who looked to the future and were not afraid to be change agents in contributing to a stronger, more unified Crawford County! Much like our local historical societies collaborating to form the Crawford County History Alliance, we hope that more organizations who are duplicating services will come to see the wisdom in coming together for their own "future good."

On a recent trip to Holland, MI, I learned of the Danish practice of hygge (pronounced hoo-gah). The Danes believe that by seeking and/or creating atmospheres that exude peace, coziness, comfort, harmony, warmth, and contentment, we can learn to increase our own happiness and our love for our home. Let us learn to look to our future without fear, but instead shape and pursue our future with hygge. And as we celebrate the Foundation's ruby anniversary, let's remember those infamous ruby slippers and Dorothy's lesson from *The Wizard of Oz*, "There's no place like home."

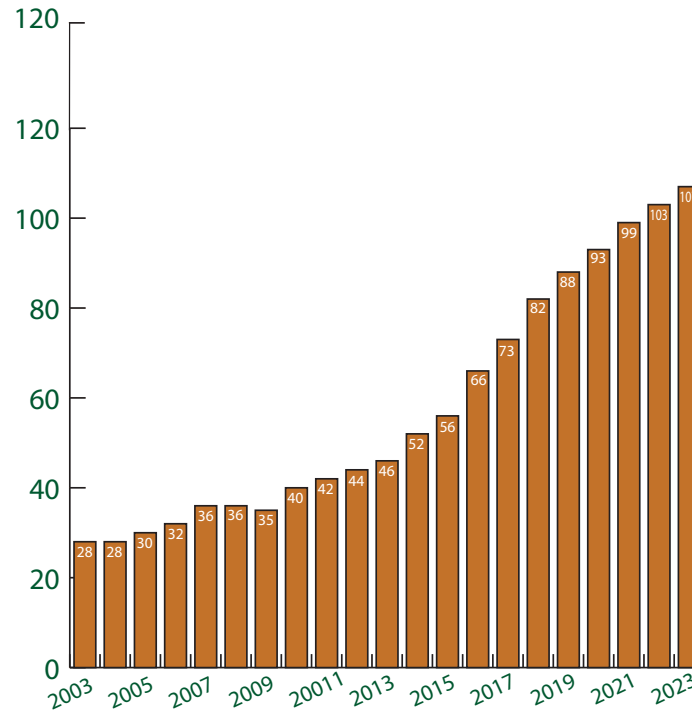

**The Crestline Canteen** - was how the Crestline civilian community supported U.S. troops in WWII. Beginning in 1942, three shifts of committees a day for 1,299 days volunteered to offer soldiers food, magazines, playing cards, writing paper and more as the trains they were being transported on stopped in Crestline. Volunteers came from all over North Central Ohio to ensure the canteen stayed open 24/7, as security required that the troops' movements were not public information – meaning they could show up at any time. As columnist Timothy Brian McKee put it, "...when the world turned dangerous, ...the Village of Crestline rose up and demonstrated to American soldiers exactly what it was they were fighting for: a place where people are kind, thoughtful and generous."

The more dust or clouds in the Earth’s atmosphere, the redder the moon will appear. There are usually two – four blood moons occurring annually. **The Lesser Angle-wing Katydid** – is such an amazing leaf mimic that it can blend in so well you might not see it, even when looking directly at one. Its brief, raspy rattle can usually be heard from high in the trees. This insect musician belongs to a subfamily called false katydid since it sings in quick rattles rather than “Katy did, Katy didn’t.” A cousin of grasshoppers and crickets, katydids can be beneficial to your garden since they eat other small insects that are detrimental to plants.

**The Dapper Cabin** – is a log cabin built in the 1800's by the Dapper family on the south side of what is now Remlinger Road. German immigrants, the Dapper's lived there until 1938, when the farm was sold to the Hoover family. Katie Hoover later donated the cabin to Colonel Crawford Schools, and in 2012, it was saved and reconstructed on the school's campus by volunteers known as "The Cabin Guys." The cabin runs on donations and is available for events by calling Ted Bruner at 419-989-1316.

**This aerial view of Bucyrus** – at night highlights the Lincoln Highway on which the Foundation and the Great American Crossroads Mural are located. In 1919, the longest motorized military convoy ever assembled began its journey – without maps or service stations – from Washington DC to San Francisco. The then 28-year-old Dwight Eisenhower, a lieutenant colonel, was on this trip which later influenced his drive during his presidency to construct our interstate highway system. 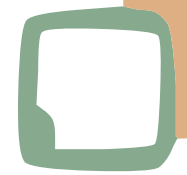
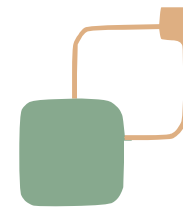

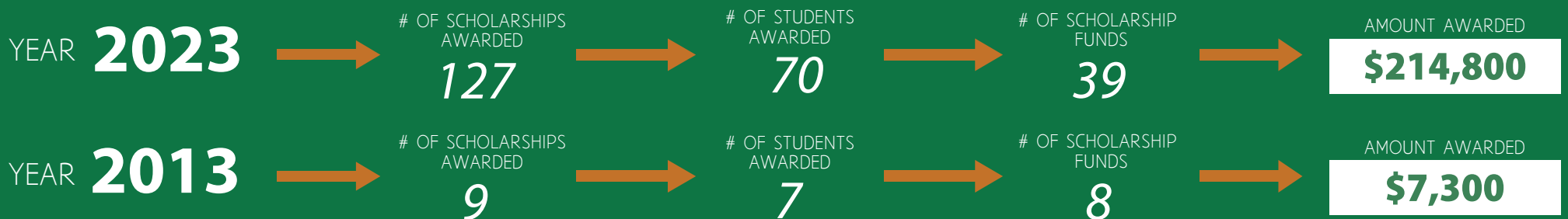
