A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



In 2005 at Kenyon College, novelist David Foster Wallace delivered what is considered by many to be one of the best commencement speeches of all time. He began by noting two young fish swimming along when an older fish swam by and asked them how the water was. This prompted one of the young fish to look at the other and ask, "What the hell is water?" Wallace's point is that sometimes the most obvious realities are often the ones most difficult to recognize and talk about. He goes on to claim that living a compassionate life and being a good person require us to focus on the inner lives of others, which is difficult since our natural default setting tends to be one of selfishness. He makes the case that each

of us has the power to choose an attitude of being kind to and doing what is best for others, which in turn makes the world better for everyone, including the one that chose that attitude.

I believe Wallace's premise helps explain why so many Crawford County organizations continue to work in silos rather than join forces, or even just collaborate. Stuck in this limiting default setting, they can only see how these unifications might affect them and their own identity, and can't see the "water"- the benefits that would come for all of us if we worked together as one. The default setting is "What do I want" rather than "What would be best for the entire community?"

Similarly, psychology professor John Jost wrote in his book, A Theory of System Justification, that humans are motivated to defend and justify systems even if these systems work against them. According to him, "people exhibit system - justifying tendencies to defend and rationalize existing ... arrangements - ...even at the expense of individual and collective self - interest." So according to this theory, people tend to see what exists as not just the way things are, but even as how they should be, which in turn (of course) reduces support for challenging the status quo.

Seeing the value of collective impact and having more people working towards the same goals, our Foundation has been working closely with United Way of North Central Ohio to better align our two organizations' grant making processes. I commend our Board of Directors for being open to this change and trying to improve our processes in order to better serve the community, and I thank United Way for agreeing to be our partner in this endeavor. I also commend our local historical societies for recently forming the Crawford County History Alliance (CCHA) and realizing the impact of joining forces to take on community projects.

Such tremendous growth can be contributed to several factors – the office that gave us "community presence," purposeful Board leadership, a generous community. But I feel that this growth can also be attributed to what Simon Sinek refers to in his book, Start With Why, as The Golden Circle. Sinek writes, "...The Golden Circle finds order and predictability in human behavior. Put simply, it helps us understand why we do what we do. The Golden Circle provides compelling evidence of how much more we can achieve if we remind ourselves to start everything we do by first asking why."

The capital T Truth is that Home is Why. Let us strive to make OUR why our default setting.






FROM THE BEGINNING...



Predator of the Garden – A carnivore, the praying mantis has a voracious appetite and a preference for grasshoppers and beetles and other insects that coincidentally do the most damage to crops – a natural form of pest control! 
